- Does the dialogue move the story forward?
- o Is there an appropriate mix of dialogue and narrative?

Craft (10 points):

- o Does the story move along at an appropriate pace, without rushing or dragging?
- o Is there good use of all five senses in descriptions?

- O Does the author 'show' rather than 'tell'?
